As a result, all parents will be given full refunds. Parents whose children still wanted a spot on next year's trip, did not take out their refund. That holds a spot for those students, barring further complications, to attend next year with the lower class (current 5th graders). If they don't want their money back now, but decide in the fall they do, this year's 6th graders can get a full refund up until the first DC meeting in the fall.

The plan is that the current 5th graders and any current 6th graders (who did not get a refund) will all get to go together next year. This will mean we will have a very full trip next year, and all parents for both the current 5th and 6th grade classes, will have to be drawn from a lottery, and be willing to chaperone, next year to attend.
