Progress Reports

Normally, every two and a half weeks, CES students receive a Progress Report. Just like a Grade Report, the Progress Report shows student grades up to that point in time. Traditionally, we skip the first Progress Report because much of the beginning of school is about the teaching and practicing of routines and procedures. Many tests are taken, but these aren't the kinds of tests we put in the grade book. These are tests to measure the student's knowledge now, at the beginning of the year. Student scores from these tests are used for teacher information and will be compared to scores on similar tests throughout the year. The first report of progress will be at mid-term. Students will be sent home with the Mid-Term Report on Tuesday, September 19.
